Alvin Hollis Williams, 79, died Sunday, Aug. 5, 2007, in Wyoming as the result of a heart attack.

He was born Nov. 9, 1927, in Fair Grove, the son of Alvin P. Williams and Vera Hollis Williams.

He graduated from Fair Grove High School. He then went to work for MFA Feed Co. in Fair Grove. He had an opportunity to work for Union Pacific Railroad in 1949 in Cheyenne, Wyo. After two years, he was called to serve his country in the U. S. Army and was involved in the Korean War for two years. After an honorable discharge from the army, he went back to the Pacific Railroad and worked as a conductor until his retirement. He had the same credentials as a sheriff.

He was preceded in death by his father, mother, a baby sister and a brother, Wilbur Williams.

Survivors include his brothers and sisters, Gloria Bilyeu, Loria Staffen, Buford Williams and wife Tiny, Milda Climer, Milburn Williams

and Robert Williams; many nieces and nephews and other family and friends.

Memorial graveside services will be held at 10:00 AM Saturday, August 18, 2007 at the Rock Prairie Cemetery with Bro. Jerry Grant officiating. Burial will be in the Rock Prairie Cemetery under the direction of the Butler Funeral Home of Bolivar. Military Honors will be conducted at the graveside service by the AMVETS Post #114, Flemington, MO.
