Charles Delbert Floyd, 81, Bolivar, died Saturday, September 3, 2011 at his home. The son of James Austin and Bertha (Frazier) Floyd, he was born in Hermitage, October 22, 1929. Charles served in the U. S. Army from July 1948 to July 1953. He was a business manager working many years at the Bolivar Locker Plant and running a meat sales route.
