



Delmer F. Laursen

February 20, 1922 - October 7, 2007

Delmer F. Del Laursen, 85, Bolivar, died Sunday, October 7, 2007 at his home. The son of Danish immigrants, Marius and Gerda (Moeller) Laursen, he was born at rural Marcus, Iowa, February 20, 1922, the second of nine children. He was baptized in the Danish Lutheran Church at Marcus, IA and confirmed in St. John s Evangelical and Reformed Church, Peterson, IA. He was a past member of Zion Lutheran Church, Moberly and Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Kansas City. In 1939 he graduated from Brooke High School, Peterson, IA and attended National Business Training School, Sious City, IA in 1940. He enlisted in the U S Navy in March 1941 and trained at Great Lakes, IL. In November 1941 he went aboard the battleship, Colorado, at Bremerton, WA serving 52 months on that ship. He served in the Pacific theater participating in 10 major assaults on enemy islands and atolls and was in Tokyo Bay on the day of surrender September 2, 1945. After World War II he farmed in Iowa and Missouri. On August 29, 1944 he was united in marriage to Ruby Nelson, his high school sweetie. He was a past member of the Peterson, IA American Legion, Moberly VFW, Plattsburg VFW and Gladstone Lions Club. His parents, 3 brothers and 2 sisters preceded him in death. Survivors include his wife of 63 years, Ruby, of the home; 4 children, Carole Cantrell, Gladstone, MO, Lorna Raden, Shawnee, KS, Brian Laursen, Plattsburg, MO and Douglas Laursen, Kansas City; 1 brother, Larry Laursen, Milford, IA; 2 sisters, Rheta Dean, Peterson, IA and Linda Laursen, Arizona City, AZ; 5 grandchildren; and 2 great-grandchildren.
