Louis Earl Redman, 91, Bolivar, died Wednesday, August 17, 2011 at Citizens Memorial Healthcare Facility, Bolivar. The son of William R. and Maude (Strader) Redman, he was born in Aldrich January 31, 1920. During World War II, Earl served in the U. S. Army Air Force as a member the Flying Tigers. After being wounded and recovering, he was a chauffeur for General Claire Chennault. Earl and his wife, Frances, were married February 22, 1945. They lived in California for many years where he was a bio-med technician at San Bernardino County Hospital. Earl was a member of Campbell Grove Missionary Baptist Church, Howard S. Keeling American Legion Post and Amvets Post #114. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge in Wentzville for over 50 years and Scottish Rites. His parents, 4 brothers, Wallace, Loren, Ralph and Bob Redman, and 3 sisters, Josie Slagle, Anna Greer and Wilma Ruth Harralson, preceded him in death.
