Eugene Albert 'Pinky' Kent, son of Jesse A. Kent and Florence Nightingale Kent, was born on April 18, 1931 in Sheldon, MO and passed away July 8, 2007 at his home in Bolivar, MO at the age of 76 years, 2 months, and 20 days.

Gene, or as his friends all knew him "Pinky" was an avid sports fan and supporter of local teams. He played high school football and basketball in Bolivar and always kept a special interest in the local high school and college teams. Gene was also a lover of music and was especially proud of representing Bolivar in 1947 at the National Music Competition where his sextet took 2nd place. The love of music continued all his life as he served as Bugler for the local V.F.W. for over 20 years and loved to sing solos of 'Amazing Grace' at his church.

Gene served in the U.S. Army during the Korean conflict from 1952-1954 and shortly after became a Mason. He had recently been honored as a 50 year member at the local Masonic Lodge #195 A.F. & A.M.

In 1962, on July 6, he made Lula Mustain his wife at the First Christian Church in Bolivar.

He and Lula spent many happy years together in Bolivar and had just celebrated their 45th wedding anniversary.

Those who know Gene will know that among his interest, other than sports and music, he also loved fishing, hunting, golfing, woodworking, and several years ago, when he took up painting as a hobby.

Gene worked at several jobs over his lifetime, but thought most fondly of his 13 years as custodian at Bolivar Schools. In fact he and Lula started and maintained a fund to insure all kindergarten children would have access to all the milk they could drink. Gene is survived by his wife Lula, sons, Michael Kent and wife Aline of Pelham, NC; Kevin Kent of Fair Play; and daughter, Jayne Dobbs and husband Darren of Mountain Grove, MO. Four Grandsons, Michael Kent Jr., Jonathon Kent, David Kent and Allen Dobbs. Three great grandchildren, Chris, Lauren and Brad. Also surviving is his sister, Evelyn Toelle and husband Charles of Oklahoma City, OK.
