Mrs. Frances Imogene Jean Inman, age 89, of Bolivar, Missouri passed away on Monday morning, April 18, 2011 at her home from a sudden heart attack.

Jean was born August 4, 1921 in Mount Vernon, Missouri to Arlie M. Holmes and Lora M. (Cochran) Holmes.
