James Fredric Toner, age 72, of Bolivar, Missouri passed away at 9:30am, Wednesday, December 12, 2007 at Citizens Memorial Hospital.

He was born on February 11, 1935 in Kansas City, MO. to Fred Arvil and Ruth Esther (Mathews) Toner.

Jim was born and raised in Kansas City, graduating from Northeast High School in 1954. He earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Central Missouri and a master's degree from Lincoln University.

He was a basketball and baseball coach and teacher from 1957-1966 at Dixon High School in Dixon, MO. Jim developed the second middle school in the state of Missouri, Dixon Middle School, and was principal there from 1966-1982. From 1982-1997 Jim taught social sciences at Fairhill High School in Dallas, Texas.

At 6' 7" tall, Jim was an athlete who became a coach and educator. He dedicated 40 years to education and believed first and foremost in educating the whole child. He touched countless lives in his career. Jim was quite a presence and impacted those around him with his intelligence and humor. He was a special husband, father, grandfather, mentor and friend.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Fred and Ruth, and one sister, Nancy Toner Smith.

Jim was extremely proud of his two daughters and five grandchildren. He is survived by his wife Jan of Bolivar, MO; two daughters, Lisa Doyle and her husband Bradley, of Bolivar, MO; and Michele Youmans and her husband John of Atlanta, GA. His five grandchildren are Lieren Doyle and Colin Doyle, of Bolivar, MO; and Stephanie Youmans, Michael Youmans, and Brandon Youmans, of Atlanta, GA. He is also survived by one brother Jerry Toner of Kansas City, Missouri.

Funeral services will be held at a later date under the direction of the Butler Funeral Home of Bolivar.
