



## Joe Ben Shelton

March 7, 1934 - June 2, 2025

Joe Ben Shelton was born in Polk County on March 7, 1934, to Benjamin and Isa (Matthews) Shelton. He peacefully went to be with his Lord on June 2, 2025. Joe Ben grew up on the family farm and went to school at Collins School, a small one room schoolhouse. He went on to graduate from high school at Marion C. Early in 1951.

Joe spent his entire life affecting the lives of young people. Following his service to his country with the U.S. Army in Korea, he went to college at Southwest Baptist College and Southwest Missouri State University to become a teacher and coach. After a number of years as a teacher and basketball coach, he worked with disadvantaged youth through the Job Corp program preparing them with skills to be successful. He helped establish Johnson County Community College, being the fourth person hired.

About this time, he moved his family back to the family farm in Morrisville while he received his EdD in Education from the University of Arkansas. Joe went back to Marion C. Early for a year as the high school principal where he was influencing kids again. An opening became available and Dr. Joe became a beloved professor at Southwest Baptist University. Almost every student who went through the school had him in class. He loved the students so much and could remember them years later, including where they sat in class. Dr. Joe also loved all the athletes and was a steadfast supporter. He loved

attending all the games, whether it was basketball, football, baseball, track or cross country.

When he wasn't at school, Joe was working on the farm. He was really a full-time professor/full time farmer. Many long days were needed to manage his cattle and fescue crops. Additionally, long hours were spent preparing for the classes the next day. During this time, he was approached to represent his area of the county on a new plan to build a hospital. While on the board of Citizens Memorial Hospital, not only was the hospital built, but through the vision of the original board, the CMH campus has become what you see today.

But as much as he worked and cared for students and his community, he loved his family so much more. He met the love of his life, Donna Lewis, his second year at Southwest Baptist College. They were married in 1958 and celebrated 67 years of life together in May. The two taught their three children, Michael, Julia and Carla, how to live a Christian life, work hard and take responsibility, and what a loving home should be.

Joe loved the Lord with all his heart. He always said one of the most important decisions he ever made was accepting the Lord as his Savior and he found Him at a chapel service at SWBC. His life was spent serving the Lord and trying to be the best Christian he could be. So many people throughout his life were recipients of his love.

Joe Ben is survived by his wife Donna, children Michael (Bobbie) Shelton, Julia (John) Conley and Carla (Ray) Godfrey. His grandchildren Brittany Shelton (Dr. Tom Adams), Grant Godfrey, Clint (Jessie) Godfrey, Ben Shelton (Dr. Briann Sutton), and Bradley Shelton. He had two great grandchildren, Noah and Rosie. He was preceded in death by his parents, siblings Ruth Cox, Grace Hall, Wilma Emmert, Roy Shelton, Wanda Smith, and Ralph Shelton.

With such a large family there were many nieces and nephews whom he loved very much.

Everyone has a Joe Ben, Joe, Jody, or Dr. Joe story to tell. The best stories were daddy stories. He will be so missed but not forgotten any time soon.

“ I am so happy that I had the opportunity to study under his leadership at Southwest Baptist University. He supervised my internship in 1991! What an amazing academic leader!

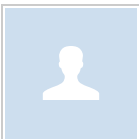
