



## Joyce Mae Hood

Joyce M. Hood, 68, of Humansville, passed away Monday, May 14, 2012, at Cox South Hospital, Springfield. She was born in Delavan, Minnesota, the only daughter of Ernest and Esther Nohrenberg Wheeler. Joyce was a graduate of Bolivar High School and upon graduation from cosmetology school she moved to Humansville and began her life-long career as a beautician, owning her own shop for many, many years. As a courtesy to her customers not having transportation, she would frequently provide transportation for them to and from the beauty shop. Joyce married Jerry Hood on April 2, 1966, and he preceded her in death August 13, 2011, after 45 years of marriage. Joyce was active in the community affairs of Humansville. She was a longtime member of the Humansville Chamber of Commerce, serving as secretary and treasurer for many years. She took an active role in the Humansville Fall Festival overseeing the various Festival exhibits and being responsible for paying winning exhibitors and other expenses of the Fall Festival. She enjoyed living on the farm and caring for her cows and cats. She enjoyed the outdoors and loved to go deer hunting in times past. She was an artist and particularly enjoyed china painting. She was a member of the Zion Lutheran Church of Bolivar. She was preceded in death by her parents, husband Jerry, brothers Roger and Bernard Wheeler. She is survived by her brother Duane Wheeler and wife Nancy of Parker, Texas; brother-in-law John Hood of Humansville; nephews Scott Wheeler and wife Summer of Carrollton, Texas, and Steven Wheeler and wife Lisa of Midlothian,

Virginia; along with other relatives and close friends. Funeral services will be held 1 PM Friday, May 18, 2012, at Murray Funeral Home, Humansville, with burial following in the Humansville Cemetery.
