Kenneth Leroy Ramsey, 81, Humansville, died Tuesday, May 3, 2011 in Big Spring Care Center, Humansville. The son of Barney and Carrie (Jones) Ramsey, he was born October 9, 1929 in Sanger, Texas. Ken served in the U. S. Air Force for 20 years retiring in December 1968. Ken loved fishing, pitching horseshoes, cutting wood, tinkering with anything mechanical, visiting friends and family, and especially playing with his many grandchildren. Many remember Ken as the kindly bus driver who drove a school bus at Humansville for 3 years in the early 1980s. Ken is survived by his wife, Adeline, who he married February 24, 1978. Together they moved to this area in 1981. Also surviving are his children, Kenneth Ramsey, Jr., Robert Ramsey, Richard Ramsey, Mike Ramsey, Gary Ramsey, Susan Lee, Shirley Hendrick and Sally Moose, and their mother, Janie, all of whom reside in Texas; his step-children, Dale Schmoll, Alaska, Larry Schmoll, Kevin Schmoll, Steve Schmoll, Nancy Mork, Marilyn Schmoll and Sherry Hayenga, all of Minnesota, Ron Schmoll, Craig Schmoll and Sue Storment, all of Missouri; many grandchildren and great-grandchildren.
