And no one could be as stern as Linda when she meant business and had a serious moment. And no one knew me or understood me the way she did, or vice versa. But we spent more time laughing together, and we laughed a lot! After Linda's graduation, we wrote letters to and called each other before she moved back to the Bolivar area. And then, we made plans to visit during several Homecomings. We made a commitment to be there for each other during "honor years" whenever possible,

and most of the time it was. The last year we saw each other was Homecoming 2018, and we enjoyed the parade and ate "walking tacos" at the forum. Later that evening, we spent three hours at the new hotel's firepit, just talking. It was the most memorable time ever. But little did I know that would be the last time I'd see her.

I became acquainted with her sister, Donna, and met her parents. She met my parents, and Dad and I "adopted" her into our family when Mom passed away, and she got to know my dog, Shiloh. And when Dad passed away suddenly last year, she and I spent a lot of time on the phone. This year, the tradition of holiday phone calls will change, and I'll probably catch myself picking up the phone to call her, only to realize she's not with us in this world. I hope that you, her family, will be comforted with the memories that others share with you. Your sister and aunt loved you all so much, and she spoke of you often. I hope her friends will share memories with you and with others who knew her, as we all knew a beautiful soul.
