Louis Henry Stafford, Jr., age 90 of Humansville passed away Tuesday, July 17, 2012 at his residence. He was born in Bolivar, Missouri, the son of Louis Henry Stafford, Sr. and Lessie Bowles Stafford. Known as Junior by family and friends, he served during WWII in the Army Air Force and upon discharge he worked as a civilian carpenter for the Navy for the next 30 years. He worked at several of the Navy bases that were constructed in California. Junior retired from the Civil Service and moved to Humansville in 1976. He owned and operated JR's Hungry Fox Restaurant in Humansville for the next 14 years. He served as mayor of Humansville, was a former member of the Humansville Optimist Club and attended Humansville First Baptist Church. In his later years Junior enjoyed painting pictures and scenes on saw blades, signing his finished work "Lafayette." He also built furniture and enjoyed sitting in the front porch swing. Junior was preceded in death by his parents, his first wife, Kathleen Stafford, his second wife, Vivian Stafford, brother, Bruce Stafford of Bolivar, and sister, Margorie Miller. He is survived by his wife, Katherine, of the home; daughter, Linda Brown, and husband, Noel, of Bolivar; Jan Brown, and husband, Doug of California; sons, David Stafford, and wife, Margaret, of California; Ellis Brown, and wife, June, of California; 11 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.
