Lowell Clayton Inman, age 86, of Bolivar, Missouri passed away on Friday, September 21, 2007 at his home after a long illness.

He was born June 11, 1921 in Randolph, Iowa the son of Sharon C. Inman and Gladys M. Baker Inman.

He graduated from Willard High School and attended Southwest Teachers College in Springfield, Missouri before entering Missouri University where he majored in Agriculture and minored in Music.

He was a Navy Veteran, with an honorable discharge in 1945. He married Frances Imogene Davidson Inman on February 14, 1961. He was a retired farmer, receiving Balanced Farming Award in Greene County, Missouri. Lowell served as active music director in several churches over the years. He loved music and was a talented pianist and soloist. He was a member and past church Elder at the First Christian Church in Bolivar, Missouri.
