July 15, 1940 - July 23, 2009

Paul Luther Hoebet passed away Thursday at St. John s Hospital in Springfield, Missouri. The son of Wilbur and Dorothy Hoebet, he was born July 15, 1940, in Casper, Wyoming and died eight days after his 69th birthday on July 23rd, 2009. He grew up in Lebanon, Missouri, where he was raised by his father s twin sister and her husband, Wilma and John Coats. Paul and Wanda, his wife of 48 years, were married on April 29th, 1961 in Lebanon, Missouri. Paul was a member of the United States Army for ten years, during which time he served as a drill sergeant and tank commander.
