



Robert W. Brown (Humansville)

June 7, 1922 - December 22, 2015

Robert W. "Bob" Brown, age 93, of Humansville, Missouri, passed away at Big Spring Care Center, in Humansville, on Tuesday morning, December 22, 2015.
