Warren Clark Scott, 76, passed away at his home in Weaubleau, Missouri Thursday, March 11, 2010. Warren was born January 29, 1934 in Fort Lupton, Colorado to Charles and Ruby Scott, the youngest of their five children. At age 16, Warren, along with his lifetime friend, Buster Davis, joined the RCA (predecessor of the PRCA). Warren rode bulls and Buster rode saddle broncs. They had lots of fun until he was drafted into the Army in 1954. Warren had one son and one grandson who followed in his footsteps and became bull riders. Warren graduated from Fort Lupton High School in 1951. He worked in the sugar factory, worked construction, farmed and was a truck driver.

Through it all he always had a love for horses and rodeo. In recent years, he spent his time teaching and supporting his grandchildren in their many horse activities and other activities. I remember one time he was driving the truck picking up hay bales and was going faster than I could keep up on the back of the truck. He yelled at me for letting a bale fall from the top of the lift, but he did slow down a bit. He also introduced me to fishing in the Rawah Wilderness Area at Blue Lake. Hiking the five miles in cowboy boot didn't bother him on the way up, but on the way down it was a different story. We camped one night in an empty loggers shack and a mouse got into his cigarettes and chewed most of them up. He will be missed and I wish I could be there, but I am just starting a new teaching job and their bereavement policy does not include uncles.
